# SAFE HANDS

Consent & Healthy Boundaries Theatre Workshop For Grades 1-5



#### **DESCRIPTION & LEARNING GOALS**

Participants will:

- Build communication skills: saying "no" and hearing and accepting "no"
- Explore different ways to say "no" verbal and non-verbal, body language
- Understand consent and how to check in with personal boundaries in regards to activities, touch, topics of conversation
- How to identify safe and trustworthy adults



#### **ACTIVITIES**

- An energetic drama-based warm up
- Movement game exploring personal space
- Interpreting "yes" or "no" signals by observing examples of body language
- Role-playing saying "no" to a friend and processing emotions when hearing "no"
- · Exercise exploring consent around touch
- Exploration of positive vs. negative emotions to help identify when you feel safe around someone
